Suggestions/Opinions shared by the Governing Body members are as follows:

1) Sri K.V. Vishnu Raju, Chairman, SVES

- Chairman congratulated the entire SVECW team for securing second place in the state among private engineering colleges.
- Advised including rank analysis details in the agenda from the next meeting onwards, as top-ranking students are joining the college.
- Regarding the R23 syllabus, recommended to discuss with JNTUK officials to secure approval for the curriculum of III & IV years, similar to I & II years, ensuring students have a clear understanding of their four-year academic journey.
- Assured that the Management would fully support future plans, including financial assistance.
- Emphasized the importance of foreign language training for students seeking global job opportunities and suggested appointing experienced faculty from Chennai.
- Recommended creating awareness on cyber security and establishing a dedicated Centre of Excellence for Cyber security, given the increasing prevalence of cyber-related issues and scams.

2) Sri R. Ravichandran, Vice-Chairman, SVES

• The Vice-Chairman recommended initiating the documentation process immediately rather than waiting until three months before the application submission for re-accreditation. This will ensure comprehensive coverage of all necessary points for proper compliance.

- It was suggested to conduct an in-depth review of the 12 to 15 core subjects to align the required skills with industry needs and incorporate them into the curriculum.
- Emphasized the importance of assessment and skill development.
- Faculty should be encouraged to engage with industry professionals to understand industry requirements and train students accordingly to enhance their placement opportunities.

3) Dr. D. Haritha, JNTUK University Nominee

• More labs shall be conducted along with the theory classes for better exposure.

4) Dr. Buddha Singh, UGC Nominee

- He expressed his satisfaction with the campus infrastructure, which he observed during his last visit to the college.
- He suggested collaborating with top IITs to invite experienced faculty as resource persons for various programs.
- He appreciated the entire SVECW team for achieving the position of the secondbest college in the state and encouraged to strive toward becoming one of the leading engineering colleges in South India, recognizing the institution's strong potential in all aspects.

5) Sri K. Aditya Vissam, Secretary, SVES

- Commended and congratulated the entire SVECW team for the college's outstanding performance in results, placements, and research.
- Expressed delight over students' active participation in various competitions.
- Recommended studying the best practices of MKSSS's Cummins College of Engineering for Women, Pune, given their exceptional placement record.
- Advised identifying the skill sets required for core industries and training students accordingly.
- Acknowledged the ongoing research efforts and encouraged faculty to publish their work in reputed journals such as Scopus, SCI, WoS, and IEEE Xplore.
- Emphasized that engineering colleges from Maharashtra performed well in the recent eBAJA competition held in Hyderabad due to their strong focus on core subject research and advised to look into that way.
- Suggested that interested faculty shall collaborate with students in publishing articles related to competitions like eBAJA, Concrete Canoe, etc.

- Encouraged the involvement of all faculty members to strive for greater achievements, as the sky is the limit.

- 8) Study of best placement & training practices being practiced by MKSSS's Cummins College of Engineering for Women, Pune.
- 9) Publishing articles by faculty and students together on various competitions like eBAJA, Concrete Canoe, etc.
