Suggestions/Opinions shared by the Governing Body members are as follows:

1) Sri K.V. Vishnu Raju, Chairman, SVES

- List of core sector companies, who have recruited our students, shall also be included in the presentation from next meeting onwards.
- Attention should also be directed toward improving M.Tech admissions by ensuring full seat enrollment and facilitating strong placement opportunities, as students with strong domain knowledge have excellent career prospects.
- M.Tech graduates with a passion for teaching and research can also be considered for recruitment as faculty members.
- Appreciated the placements secured with GoDaddy, noting that it is a highly exclusive company that typically does not visit campuses for recruitment.
- Ensure the production of high-quality publications and patents, and work toward all faculty members attaining a Ph.D. by 2030.

2) Sri K. Aditya Vissam, Secretary, SVES

- Appreciated the presentation.
- Congratulated the entire SVECW team for securing excellent placements.
- Emphasized the need for greater focus on research activities.
- Highlighted that curriculum design is a crucial component of academic success and requires increased attention, including collaboration with industry experts during its development.
- Stressed the importance of recruiting more Ph.D. holders and encouraging existing faculty to complete their Ph.D. at the earliest, with serious commitment.
- Advised continuing strong collaboration with Alumni to enhance placement opportunities through their networks, as demonstrated by placements such as GoDaddy.

3) Prof. G.V.R. Prasada Raju, Professor in CE, JNTUK (University Nominee)

- Strengthen efforts toward improving NIRF rankings and pursue international collaborations, as these are increasingly significant factors in accreditation and ranking processes.
- He advised that consultancy work be taken up with seriousness and emphasized the need to generate substantial revenue, given the Institution's access to advanced equipment. He also highlighted the importance of focusing more on real-time and international projects that offer broad societal benefits.
- He also informed that a new Government policy is forthcoming, under which all Universities and Institutions will be expected to generate their own revenue to meet their expenditure.

4) U. Chandra Sekhar, VC, GGU

- Identify the major thrust areas and establish faculty cohorts based on common research interests.
- Advised to review the feasibility of introducing M.Tech. in Defence Technology.
- Recommended intensifying efforts to secure more placements in the VLSI domain, given the strong industry demand and promising career prospects.
- Suggested initiating student and faculty exchange programmes with foreign universities.

5) Dr. Buddha Singh, UGC Nominee

- Expressed his utmost satisfaction with the institution's progress toward higher academic excellence and congratulated the entire team for their innovative and continuous efforts in advancing the institution..

6) Sri K. Sai Sumanth, Jt. Secretary, SVES

- He congratulated the Principal and the entire SVECW team for their exemplary performance and their dedication to elevating the institution to greater heights.

7) Sri G.V. Ramachandra Rao, RJD, Kakinada (State Govt. Nominee)

- It was advised that the Institution include a University or Government representative/nominee on the Selection Board for faculty recruitment.
